

STEP BY STEP DISINFECTION PROCEDURE

1. Locate the product to be used and confirm expiry date has not passed.

Note: Most disinfectants have a shelf life of 6 months or less.

2. Prepare a wash basin with a clean towel for use after the procedure is complete to wash hands and face. Also include access to eye wash in the event of contact with eyes.

3. Put on required protective equipment using the CDC PPE Sequence as your guide.

Note: Consult product SDS and label for information. CDC PPE Sequence reference is available under resources at secure.disinfectright.com

4. Using a checklist, apply disinfectant to all high touch surfaces identified and ensure proper dwell time is achieved.

5. Once dwell time has been achieved, wipe surfaces with a clean, damp cloth if required.

6. Properly wipe down all equipment used to apply disinfectant, ensure chemical containers are sealed and store all products in secure areas below eye level for storage safety.

Note: Storing products below eye level ensures safety in the event an unsealed container is stored and doesn't end up being poured on the person accessing the chemical.

7. Remove required protective equipment using the CDC PPE Sequence as your guide.

8. Wash hands, face and any other areas of the body that were exposed during the process for at least 20 seconds.
